### **Bauhaus Textiles: Women Artists And The Weaving Workshop ...**

Weaving is a method of textile production in which two distinct sets of yarns or threads are interlaced at right angles to form a fabric or cloth. Other methods are knitting, crocheting, felting, and braiding or plaiting. The longitudinal threads are called the warp and the lateral threads are the weft, woof, or filling. (Weft is an old English word meaning "that which is woven"; compare leave ...

Well-known for her mastery of weaving, developed her artistic practice at the Bauhaus and Black Mountain College. Albers went on to establish weaving as a new medium for modern art. In her designs for industrial mass production and her unique weavings, Anni Albers proves her prowess at the loom and her proficiency with textiles.

### **Bauhaus Movement**

The studio's textiles, along with architectural wall painting, adorned the interiors of Bauhaus buildings, providing polychromatic yet abstract visual interest to these somewhat severe spaces. While the weaving studio was primarily comprised of women, this was in part due to the fact that they were discouraged from participating in other areas.

When Gunta Stölzl left the Bauhaus in 1931, Anni Albers took over her role as Head of the Weaving Workshop, making her one of the few women to hold such a senior role at the school. The Bauhaus at Dessau was closed in 1932 under pressure from the Nazi party and moved briefly to Berlin, permanently closing a year later in August 1933.

Considering again the case of textiles and the Bauhaus, the useful question may not be whether the

men and women produced different types of work—because they did. Rather, we might ask why it took so long for the art world to value the characteristics of the Bauhaus women's work, such as textiles.

### **Why Is Work by Female Artists Still Valued Less Than Work ...**

As a female student at the radical Bauhaus art school, Albers was discouraged from taking up certain classes. She enrolled in the weaving workshop and made textiles her key form of expression. She inspired and was inspired by her artist contemporaries, among them her teacher, Paul Klee, and her husband, Josef Albers.

"Textile was especially significant in Bauhaus, but the women who taught and did creative work in the school were forgotten with time," Ben Moshe says. "I created a very typical rug in the Bauhaus style, referencing grids of weaves that female designers created in that period."
