These formative assessments are designed to gather additional data when red flags occur based on in-class performance with struggling learners or during a review of universal screening data. Unlike universal screeners, diagnostic assessments aim to take a more complete look at where students are currently performing within a subject area.

Universal screeners that only identify students who are at risk of struggling are less useful. Diagnostic Assessments. Timing: Often a follow up to screening assessments, these are administered as needed in response to student need Audience: Teachers, instructional specialists, special education teachers, and parents

Diagnostic assessments differ from screening measures. Screening measures are designed to be brief and efficient tools for quickly identifying who might be at risk. Diagnostic assessments are then used to confirm the initial screening results, and to inform intervention by determining a student's particular difficulties.

Screening. Screening is the process of using tests and assessments to identify students who may have disabilities. All students attending a school may be screened, and initial testing may identify students who may need individual evaluation. Screening Tool. A screening tool is used to screen students to determine who may need additional support.

Risk assessments differ from screening as they are generally more comprehensive and done by a mental health provider (e.g. psychiatrist, psychologist, social worker) to confirm suspected suicide risk, estimate imminent danger, and decide on a course of treatment.
